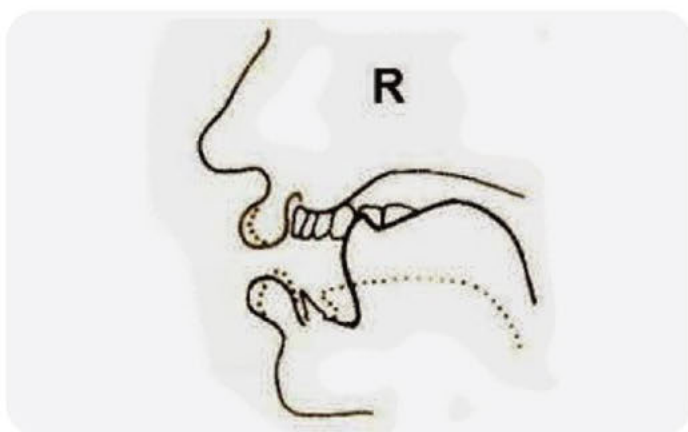

# O som de /r/ ou /ɹ/

## OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: CONSOANTES AULA 13

Este é um som comum em algumas regiões do Brasil e em outras inexistente. O velho exemplo da porta e porteira com sotaque caipira ilustra bem esse som. Na figura abaixo você pode ver como nossa língua se posiciona para produzir esse som. Ao produzir o som de /r/, puxamos a língua para trás, com a parte de trás se levantando um pouco. A ponta da língua tende a se curva para cima.



### 1 Som de /r/ no começo de palavras.

**revelation** /ˌrevəˈleɪʃn/

EXAMPLE

There are no great **revelations** in the final chapter.

**right** /raɪt/

EXAMPLE

This is a step in the **right** direction.

**river** /'rɪvər/

EXAMPLE

Can we swim in the **river**?**role** /rəʊl/

EXAMPLE

He was very good in the **role**.**row** /rəʊ/

EXAMPLE

She arranged the chairs in two **rows**.**rules** /ru:lz/

EXAMPLE

You can't just change the **rules**.**run** /rʌn/

EXAMPLE

John can **run** very fast.**wrong** /rɔ:ŋ/

EXAMPLE

The information is **wrong**.

## 2 Som de /r/ no meio de palavras.

**around** /ə'raʊnd/

EXAMPLE

They walked **around** the lake.**different** /'dɪfrənt/

EXAMPLE

She offered us five **different** kinds of cake.

**fresh** /**freʃ**/

EXAMPLE

Mushrooms don't stay **fresh** for long.**grade** /**greɪd**/

EXAMPLE

She got good **grades** on her exams.**married** /**'mærid**/

EXAMPLE

She's **married** to John.**series** /**'sɪɪ:z**/

EXAMPLE

The first episode of the new **series** is on Saturday.**seriously** /**'sɪɪəsli**/

EXAMPLE

Smoking can **seriously** damage your health.**sorry** /**'sɑ:ri**/

EXAMPLE

If you say you're **sorry** we'll forgive you.**story** /**'stɔ:ri**/

EXAMPLE

She writes poems and **stories** for children.**very** /**'veri**/

EXAMPLE

My children are still **very** young.

### 3 Som de /r/ no final de palavras.

#### **before** /bɪˈfɔːr/

EXAMPLE

Say goodbye **before** you go.

#### **ear** /ɪr/

EXAMPLE

She whispered something in his **ear**.

#### **far** /fɑːr/

EXAMPLE

The restaurant is not **far** from here.

#### **more** /mɔːr/

EXAMPLE

You'll have to be **more** careful next time.

#### **or** /ɔːr/

EXAMPLE

Hurry up **or** we'll be late.

#### **somewhere** /ˈsʌmwer/

EXAMPLE

She lives **somewhere** near Manchester.

#### **there** /ðer/

EXAMPLE

It's **there**, right in front of you!
