Simple Past - Irregular

When do I use the simple past?

- Actions that started and <u>finished</u> in the past
- When the action happened is clear (yesterday, "x time" ago, last/past time: 2 weeks ago, last month, past summer)
- Old news
- Things cannot change

An *Irregular Verb* is a verb that <u>doesn't follow</u> the regular inflection, or ending to the word, that's expected when putting it into the *past tense* or *past participle*.

Affirmative

We sent an e-mail to our teacher this morning. She wrote a book a few years ago. subj + verb (simple past)

Negative

We didn't send an e-mail to our teacher this morning. She didn't write a book a few years ago. subj + didn't / did not + verb (base form)

Interrogative

Did you send an e-mail to our teacher this morning?

Did she write a book a few years ago?

What did they eat for lunch?

WH + did + subj +verb (base form)?

Summarizing

You will **only** use the verbs in the *simple past* form when the sentences are **affirmative!**
