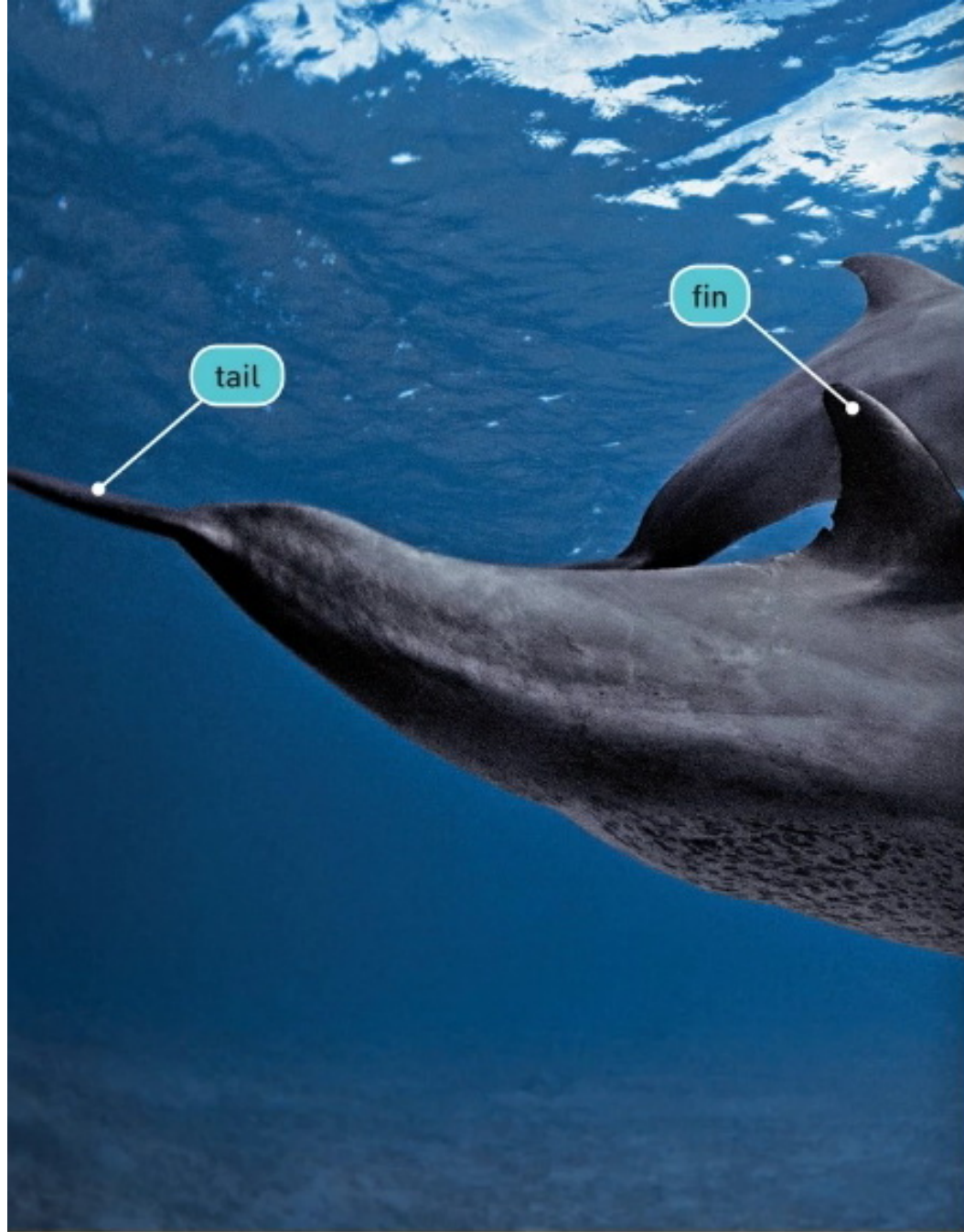

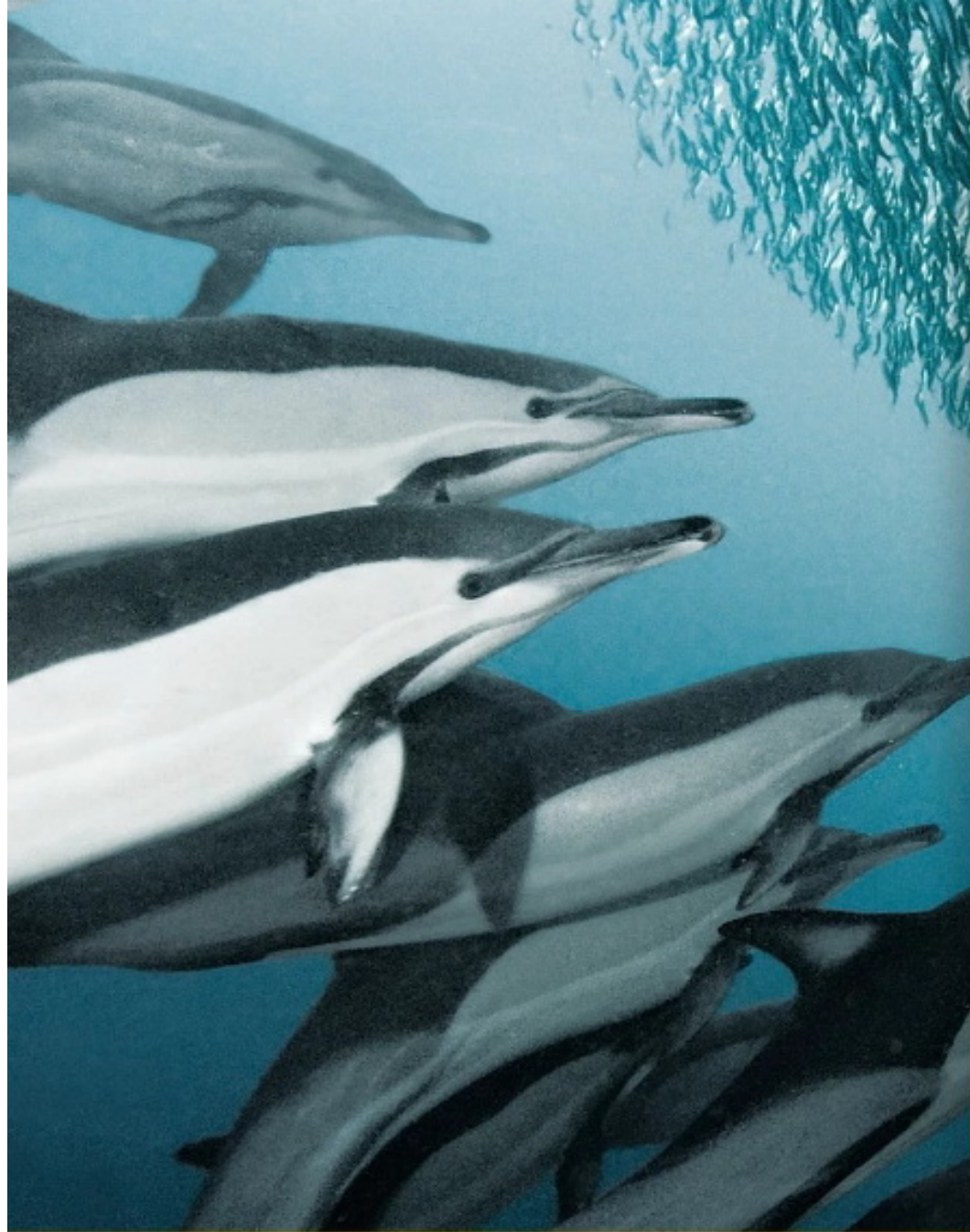

down into the water.

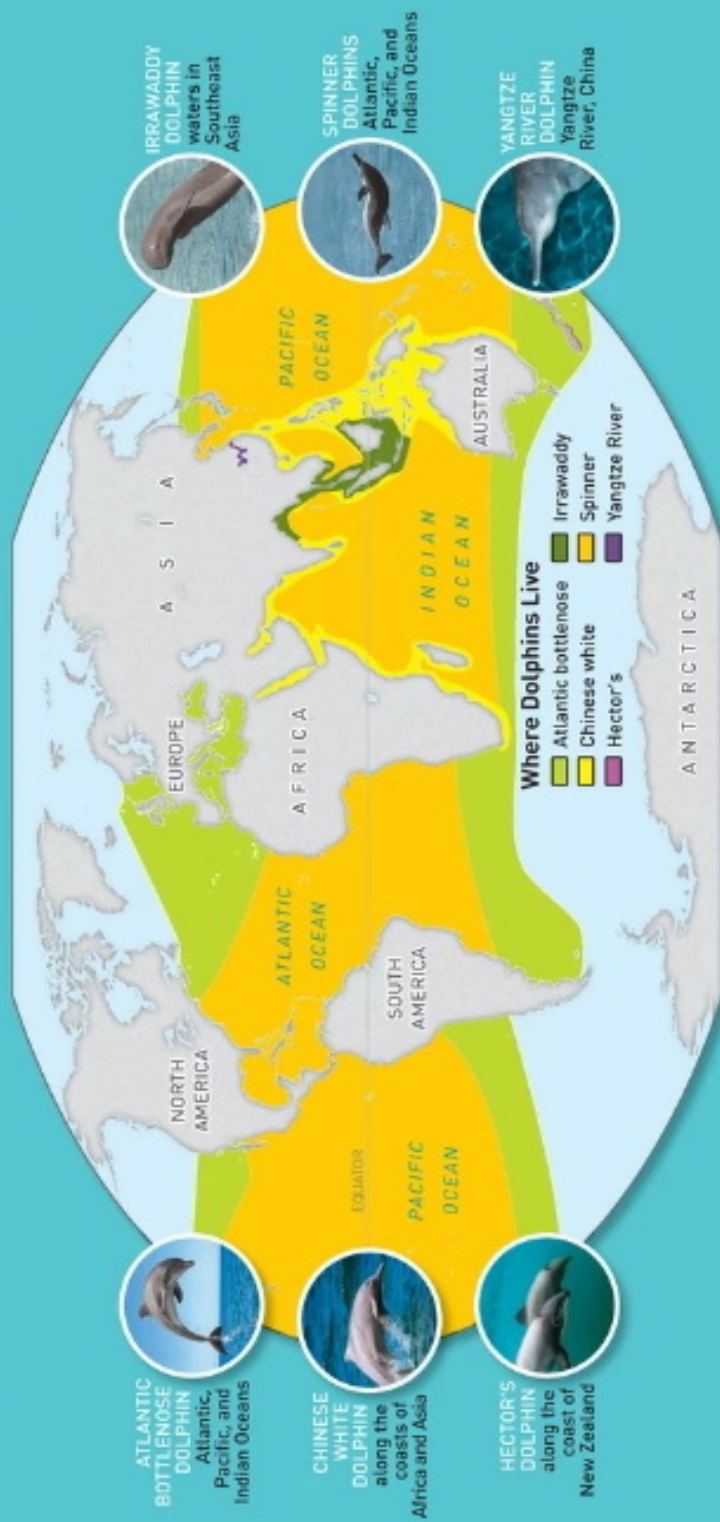
