Sentences for Anki | Lesson 19

FRONT

James inherited money from his wealthy grandmother who passed away, so he will make out pretty well.

BACK

make out = to make progress, or to go well

James' grandmother passed away and left him some money. Because she was wealthy, it was likely a large amount of money. James will do well with a large inheritance. He made out well.

FRONT

Carla and John won 3 out of 4 rounds in the tournament, and made out well with Silver and Gold medals.

BACK

make out = to make progress, or to go well

Carla and John competed in a tournament and won Silver and Gold medals. They did very well in the tournament and made out well with two trophies.

FRONT

While they were making out, Kaila realized that Jon's mustache kept scratching her face too much.

BACK

make out = to engage in physical romance, to kiss

In this case, to make out means to kiss, in a romantic relationship. This example shows that Kaila and Jon may have an issue if Jon's mustache is too long!

FRONT

Marion and Shiloh had been dating for a few months when they made out for the first time.

BACK

make out = to engage in physical romance, to kiss

Marion and Shiloh began a romantic relationship together, and decide to wait a few months before they began kissing, or making out.

FRONT

After Sarah had practiced for 3 weeks, I knew she would make out well in the competition.

BACK

make out = to make progress, or to go well

Sarah is competing, and because she has practiced for so long, she is surely going to do well. Her practice has given her the edge she needs to win, or make out well.

FRONT

After the bomb threat at the stadium, they boys were glad they were able to make it out ok.

BACK

make out = to leave or escape

Safe is priority one at any public event. In this case, the boys were able to make it out, or leave, the stadium before anything serious happened. They escaped in time.

FRONT

The movie stars had several make out scenes that seemed cheesy to the audience who wanted to see some real drama.

BACK

make out = to engage in physical romance, to kiss

In this case, the audience wanted to see some real drama and romance, but the movie stars were likely bad actors, who made the scene cheesy with a bad kissing, or make out, scene.

FRONT

When Jeff had been dealt his final cards at the poker table, he knew he was going to make out ok that night.

BACK

make out = to make progress, or to go well

Playing poker can seem risky and nerve-wrecking. In this case, Jeff is feeling confident when he is dealt his final cards. He probably believes he is going to win the hand, win some money, and therefore make out, or end up, with victory at the end of the night.

FRONT

When the mailman entered the yard and the dogs started surrounding and barking at him, he knew he needed to make it out of there quick.

BACK

make out = to leave or escape

The mailman was feeling threatened and needed to escape quickly so that the dogs would no longer continue harassing and terrifying him. The mail main, left, or made it out, quickly before the dogs did anymore damage.

FRONT

When the robbers finally received the goods they were after, they had to move quickly to make out of there before the cops came.

BACK

make out = to leave or escape

The robbers were hoping to leave quickly with the good that they stole. Once they were ready to leave, they knew it was only a matter of time before the cops showed up. They had to escape, or make out, quickly before the cops came.

FRONT

Sammie and Jason were always fighting during class, so their teacher had to split them up on different sides of the classroom.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

In this case, the two boys are likely sitting very close to each other in the classroom. They might pick at each other, or tell jokes about each other, or just get on each other's nerves. They fight so much that their teacher does not want them near each other. She moves them, or splits them up.

FRONT

The company decided to split up into two smaller companies after the executive team couldn't agree on what product to sell.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

The executive team in the original company needed to come to agreement on their product selection. Because they were not able to come to agreement, they decided to go their separate ways, or split up. They split into two companies.

FRONT

Caroline and Jason decided to split up after Jason got a job offer and had to move to California.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

Caroline and Jason are in a relationship, probably living in the same place. Jason gets a job offer and has to move to California. Because they probably don't want to be in a long distance relationship, they are going to split up, or not date any longer.

FRONT

After 17 years of touring on the road, the band finally decided to split up so they could spend more time with their families.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

You often hear of bands "splitting up" or breaking apart their relationship. Sometimes, band members will leave and start their own bands with other musicians. In this case, the band members are splitting up because they want to spend more time with their families.

FRONT

Everyone in the family was devastated when Tim and Sally split up right before their wedding was scheduled.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

Tim and Sally were going to get married very soon. When they decided to split up, or not

get married, their families were devastated. They would not be getting married.

FRONT

Once the book club got to 40 people, they realized they need to split up into two different book clubs.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

The book club has grown to be a large amount of people. With 40 people, its probably difficult for everyone to take a turn talking about the book. They need a smaller group of people and are therefore splitting up, or separating, into two smaller groups.

FRONT

When her parents split up, Hannah realized that it had a very large effect on her own emotions and mental health.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

Hannah's parents are going through a split up, or a break up. Sometimes married couples who split up will eventually get a divorce. This is likely causing a lot of emotional and mental stress on Hannah, their daughter. The split up is difficult for their family.

FRONT

Casey and Joe were going to have to split up the inheritance that their grandfather left for them so that both got equal amounts.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation of an amount.

Casey and Joe's grandfather likely passed away and left them some inheritance. They are going to split up, or divide equally, the inheritance so that both of them get an equal amount.

FRONT

The baseball team split up at the end of the season because so many of the players had incurred major injuries.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

The baseball team had played a season together, but throughout the season, many of the players were injured. Because of all the injuries, the baseball team split up, or decided not to play together again.

FRONT

After so many years of fighting, Justine and Kelvin decided to split up and start dating other people.

BACK

split up = to end a relationship or partnership, or a separation.

Justine and Kelvin have been in a relationship for many years, and have spent much of

that time fighting. They decided to split up, or end their relationship, and start dating other people.

FRONT

After they broke, Liam couldn't get over Jana, because she was the love of his life.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Sometimes in a date relationship, when one person gets dumped, or is broken up with, they are sadder than the other person. In this case, it is likely that Jana broke up with Liam for whatever reason, and now Liam is sad. He cannot recover from, or get over, the break up with Jana.

FRONT

It took Aunt Shelley three weeks to get over her bronchitis because her coughing was so bad.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Aunt Shelley has been sick with bronchitis. The coughing was so bad that it was difficult for her to recover, or to get over, the sickness. It took her three weeks to get over the sickness.

FRONT

Hailey had to get over the initial challenges of studying so that she could do well in her first semester of medical school.

BACK

get over = to overcome, or defeat

Often times going to graduate or medical school is difficult. Hailey felt it would be challenging to learn how to study well. She wanted to do well in her first semester, so she had to overcome, or get over, how difficult the challenge of studying was.

FRONT

When Jaime ran the Boston Marathon, it took him a few days to get over all the leg cramps and back pain.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Running a marathon is long, hard, and often times causing lasting pain in your body. Jaime ran the Boston Marathon and was hurting afterwards. It took him a few day to get over, or recover from all the pain.

FRONT

After her first child died in a car accident, Shauna didn't think she would ever be able to get over it.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

You can imagine that losing a child is hard for any parent. Shaun had much emotional stress and damage after her child's death, and she wasn't sure she could recover, or get over, the emotional pain.

FRONT

President Kennedy wanted NASA to get over the challenges of space journey and take the first astronauts to the moon.

BACK

get over = to overcome, or defeat

Even though traveling to space seemed difficult in the 1960s, President Kennedy wanted NASA to be the first space program to send astronauts. He wanted them to get over, or overcome, the challenges and be the first to land on the moon.

FRONT

Mr. Carson can't get over how much damage the hail did to his crops.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Mr. Carson is probably a farmer with a large amount of crops. When hail comes, it often destroys the crops. Mr. Carson is likely feeling stressed, and like his farm will not be able to recover or to harvest much crop. He cannot get over it.

FRONT

AJ and Sarah broke up 2 years ago, but Sarah still can't get over him.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Sometimes break ups are hard. Even though they broke up 2 years ago, Sarah still can't recover. Maybe she thinks about AJ often, or wishes they were still dating, but she can't get over him.

FRONT

Once he received an antibiotic, it only took Dave about 2 days to get over his chicken pox.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

Sometimes chicken pox can be painful, and last a long time! Once Dave got medicine though, his chicken pox only lasted a few more days. He was able to recover, or get over, the chicken pox quickly.

FRONT

Watching the news, Jane still could not get over how many people had been killed in the earthquake.

BACK

get over = to recover from something, emotional or physical

In this case, Jane was surprised by how many people were killed in the earthquake. She

was likely saddened by how many people died. She could get emotionally deal with, or get over, how many people did not survive.
