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OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: DITONGOS AULA 25

Ditongo é o encontro de dois sons de vogais que pertencem à mesma sílaba e são pronunciadas numa só emissão de voz. Este é o caso do som de /aɪ/ e /aʊ/ como nas palavras abaixo.

SOM DE /aɪ/

island /'aɪlənd/

EXAMPLE

He owns a house on the **island**.

irony /'aɪrəni/

EXAMPLE

There is a certain **irony** in the situation.

idea /aɪ'di:ə/

EXAMPLE

That's a great **idea**!

ice /aɪs/

EXAMPLE

My hands are as cold as **ice**.

eyelid /'aɪlɪd/

EXAMPLE

She lifted one **eyelid** to see what he was doing.

aisle /aɪl/

EXAMPLE

I always ask for an **aisle** seat, not a window seat.

fly /flaɪ/

EXAMPLE

Not all birds can **fly**.**tie** /taɪ/

EXAMPLE

She bought him a **tie**.**dye** /daɪ/

EXAMPLE

I want to **dye** my hair.**climb** /klaɪm/

EXAMPLE

We will **climb** that mountain.**high** /haɪ/

EXAMPLE

The house has a **high** wall all the way round it.**try** /traɪ/

EXAMPLE

Please **try** again later.**dry** /draɪ/

EXAMPLE

Some plants grow better in **dry** soil.**why** /waɪ/

EXAMPLE

Tell me **why** you did it.**price** /praɪs/

EXAMPLE

Can you give me a **price** for the work?

ride /raɪd/

EXAMPLE

I learned to **ride** a bike when I was six.**life /laɪf/**

EXAMPLE

This could mean the difference between **life** and death.**behind /br 'haɪnd/**

EXAMPLE

The sun disappeared **behind** the clouds.**society /sə 'saɪəti/**

EXAMPLE

We live in a multicultural **society**.**fight /faɪt/**

EXAMPLE

He did not believe that the enemy was ready to **fight**.**bright /braɪt/**

EXAMPLE

The sky was still **bright** in the west.**night /naɪt/**

EXAMPLE

She woke up in the middle of the **night**.**kind /kaɪnd/**

EXAMPLE

They sell all **kinds** of things.**blind /blaɪnd/**

EXAMPLE

One of her parents is **blind**.

SOM DE /aʊ/**outside /ˌaʊtˈsaɪd/**

EXAMPLE

Go **outside** and see if it's raining.**hour /ˈaʊər/**

EXAMPLE

I spent an **hour** on the phone.**outcome /ˈaʊtkʌm/**

EXAMPLE

It is difficult to predict the final **outcome**.**mouth /maʊθ/**

EXAMPLE

She opened her **mouth** to say something.**house /haʊs/**

EXAMPLE

A light was on inside the **house**.**down /daʊn/**

EXAMPLE

We watched as the sun went **down**.**town /taʊn/**

EXAMPLE

The nearest **town** is ten miles away.**south /saʊθ/**

EXAMPLE

Which way is **south**?

proud /praʊd/

EXAMPLE

We are all really **proud** of you!**ground** /graʊnd/

EXAMPLE

I found her lying on the **ground**.**cloud** /klaʊd/

EXAMPLE

She could see the sun through the **clouds**.**shout** /ʃaʊt/

EXAMPLE

There's no need to **shout** at me!**crowd** /kraʊd/

EXAMPLE

A small **crowd** had gathered outside the church.**now** /naʊ/

EXAMPLE

Where are you living **now**?**towel** /'taʊəl/

EXAMPLE

Don't wipe your grubby hands on my clean **towel**!**coward** /'kaʊəd/

EXAMPLE

You **coward**! What are you afraid of?**flower** /'flaʊər/

EXAMPLE

The plant has a beautiful red **flower**.

tower / 'taʊər/

EXAMPLE

The brick **tower** was built in around four months.**without** /wɪ 'ðaʊt/

EXAMPLE

He found the place **without** difficulty.**allow** /ə 'laʊ/

EXAMPLE

We do not **allow** eating in the classrooms.**around** /ə 'raʊnd/

EXAMPLE

They walked **around** the lake.**mouse** /maʊs/

EXAMPLE

I saw a **mouse** in the kitchen.**thousand** / 'θaʊznd/

EXAMPLE

There are more than a **thousand** languages.
