OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: DITONGOS

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Os sons de /aɪ/ e /aʊ/

OS SONS DA LÍNGUA INGLESA: DITONGOS AUI A 25

Ditongo é o encontro de dois sons de vogais que pertencem à mesma sílaba e são pronunciadas numa só emissão de voz. Este é o caso do som de /aɪ/ e /aʊ/ como nas palavras abaixo.

SOM DE /ai/

island / 'arland/

EXAMPLE

He owns a house on the island.

irony / arrani/

EXAMPLE

There is a certain **irony** in the situation.

idea /aɪˈdiːə/

EXAMPLE

That's a great idea!

ice /aɪs/

EXAMPLE

My hands are as cold as ice.

eyelid / ailid/

EXAMPLE

She lifted one eyelid to see what he was doing.

aisle /aɪl/

EXAMPLE

I always ask for an aisle seat, not a window seat.



fly /flaɪ/

EXAMPLE

Not all birds can fly.

tie /taɪ/

EXAMPLE

She bought him a tie.

dye /dai/

EXAMPLE

I want to **dye** my hair.

climb /klaɪm/

EXAMPLE

We will **climb** that mountain.

high /hai/

EXAMPLE

The house has a **high** wall all the way round it.

try /trai/

EXAMPLE

Please **try** again later.

dry /drai/

EXAMPLE

Some plants grow better in dry soil.

why /wai/

EXAMPLE

Tell me **why** you did it.

price /prais/

EXAMPLE

Can you give me a **price** for the work?



ride /raid/

EXAMPLE

I learned to ride a bike when I was six.

life /laɪf/

EXAMPLE

This could mean the difference between life and death.

behind /bi haind/

EXAMPLE

The sun disappeared **behind** the clouds.

society /səˈsaɪəti/

EXAMPLE

We live in a multicultural society.

fight /faɪt/

EXAMPLE

He did not believe that the enemy was ready to **fight**.

bright /braɪt/

EXAMPLE

The sky was still **bright** in the west.

night /naɪt/

EXAMPLE

She woke up in the middle of the night.

kind /kaind/

EXAMPLE

They sell all kinds of things.

blind /blaind/

EXAMPLE

One of her parents is blind.



SOM DE /au/

outside / aut said/

EXAMPLE

Go outside and see if it's raining.

hour / aʊər/

EXAMPLE

I spent an **hour** on the phone.

outcome / autknm/

EXAMPLE

It is difficult to predict the final **outcome**.

mouth /maʊθ/

EXAMPLE

She opened her **mouth** to say something.

house /haus/

EXAMPLE

A light was on inside the **house**.

down /daซn/

EXAMPLE

We watched as the sun went down.

town /taun/

EXAMPLE

The nearest **town** is ten miles away.

s<u>ou</u>th /saʊθ/

EXAMPLE

Which way is **south**?



proud /praud/

EXAMPLE

We are all really proud of you!

ground /graund/

EXAMPLE

I found her lying on the ground.

cloud /klavd/

EXAMPLE

She could see the sun through the **clouds**.

shout /∫aʊt/

EXAMPLE

There's no need to **shout** at me!

crowd /kravd/

EXAMPLE

A small **crowd** had gathered outside the church.

n<u>ow</u> /naʊ/

EXAMPLE

Where are you living **now**?

towel/'taval/

EXAMPLE

Don't wipe your grubby hands on my clean towel!

coward / kaʊərd/

EXAMPLE

You **coward**! What are you afraid of?

flower / flaver/

EXAMPLE

The plant has a beautiful red **flower**.



tower / 'tavər/

EXAMPLE

The brick tower was built in around four months.

without /wɪˈðaʊt/

EXAMPLE

He found the place without difficulty.

allow /əˈlaʊ/

EXAMPLE

We do not allow eating in the classrooms.

around /əˈraʊnd/

EXAMPLE

They walked **around** the lake.

mouse /maus/

EXAMPLE

I saw a **mouse** in the kitchen.

thousand / ˈθaʊznd/

EXAMPLE

There are more than a **thousand** languages.
