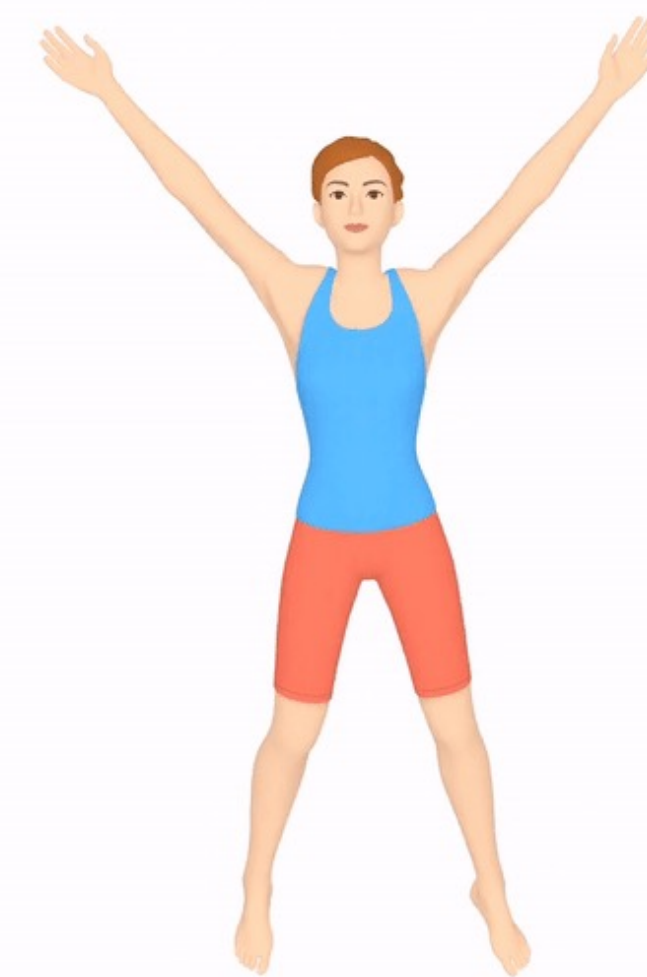

Words starting in N: no – now – never

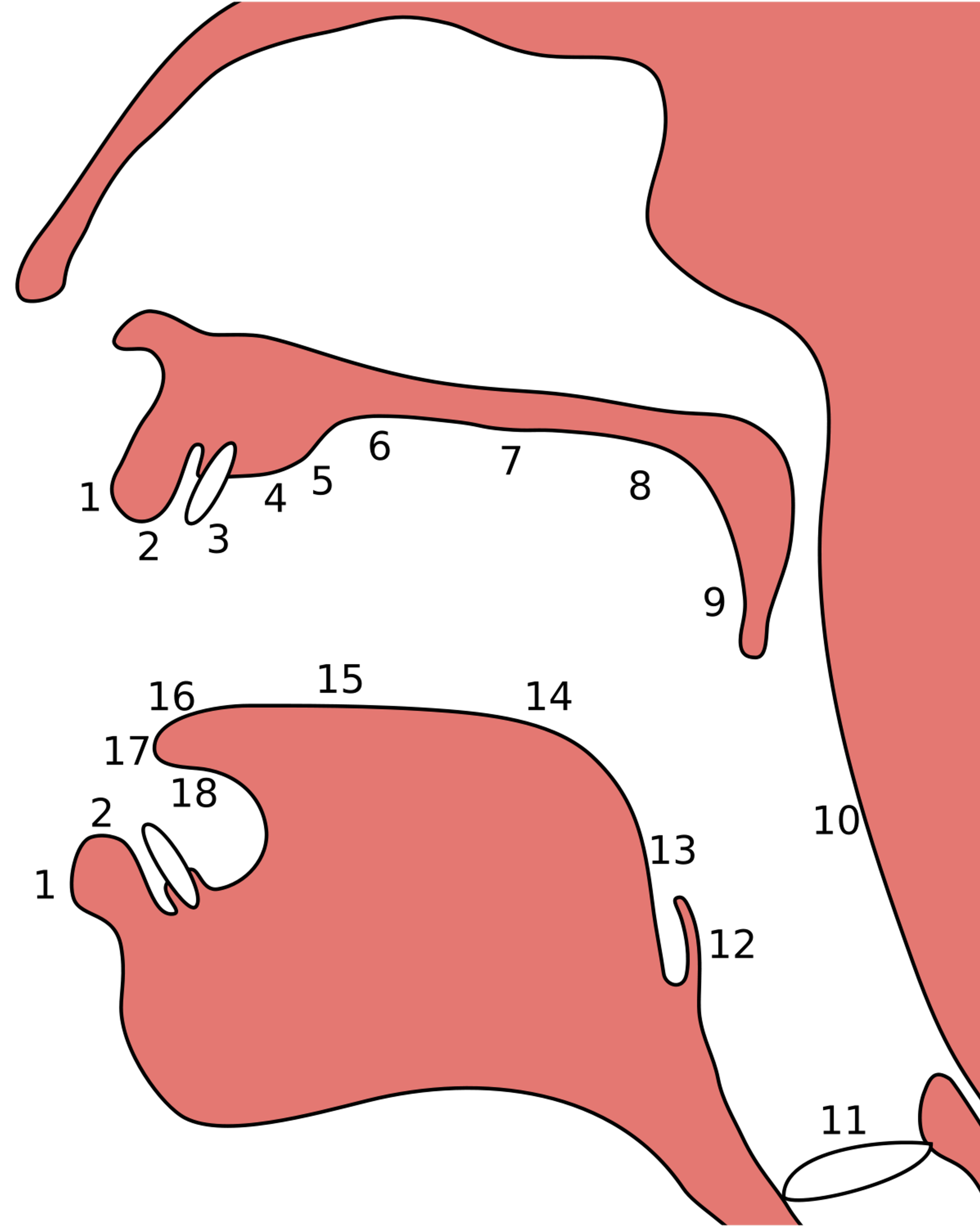
Words ending in M in Portuguese: bem – também – fim

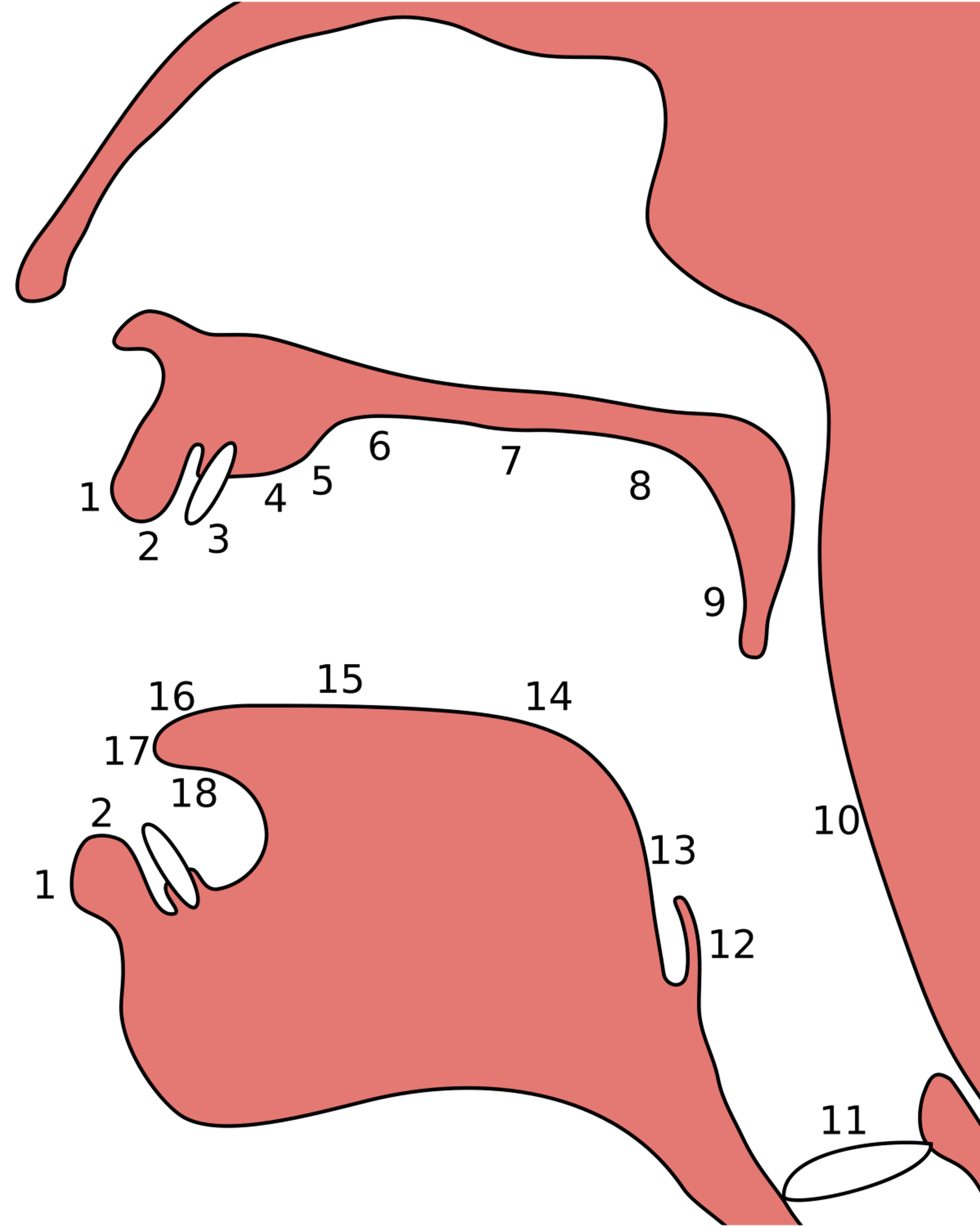

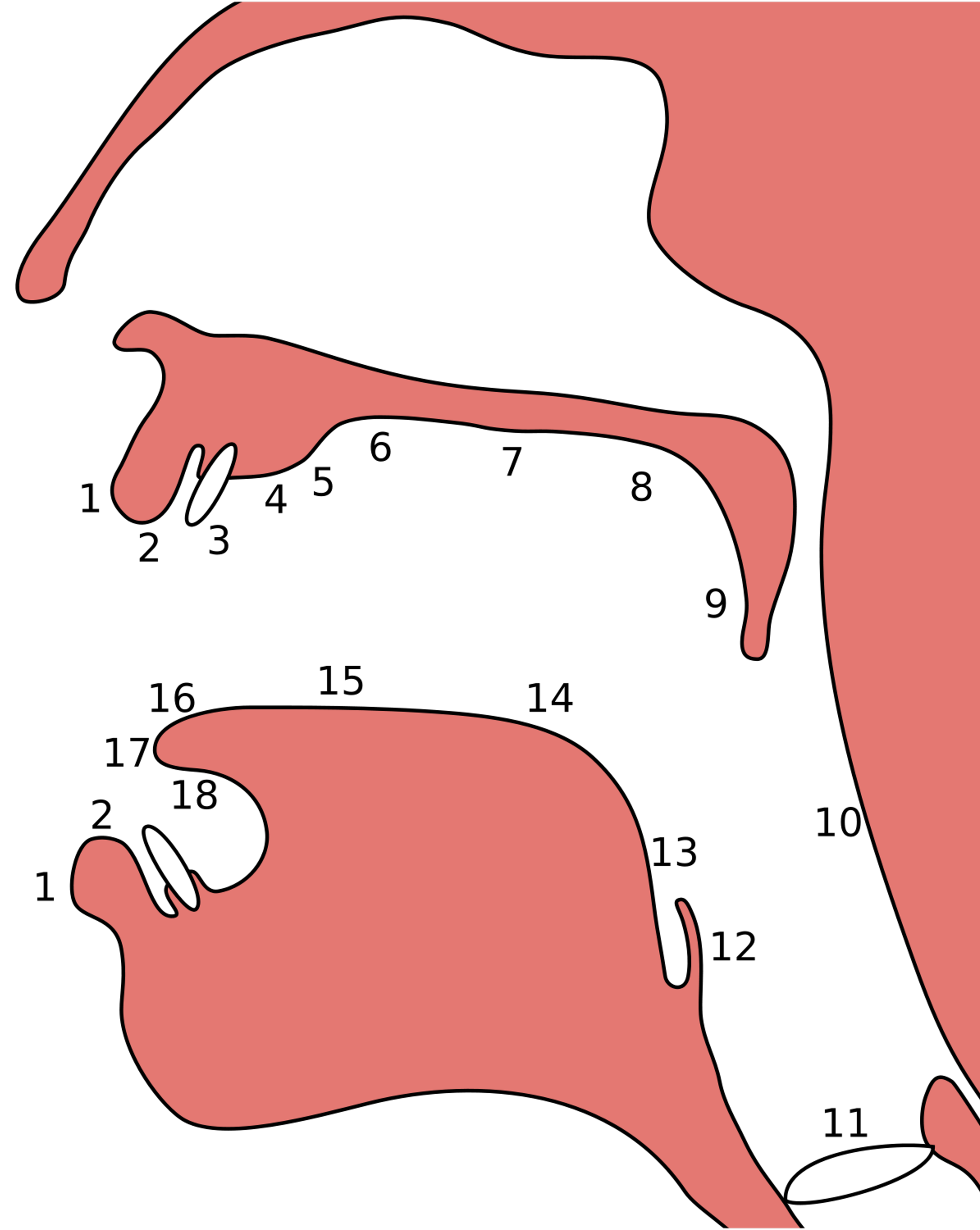

Common Mistakes



- Palavras que terminam com M: não fechar os lábios
- Palavras que terminam com N: não colocar a ponta da língua no alvéolo (atrás dos dentes de cima).
- Palavras que terminam com NG: sempre falar o G
