FRONT

BACK

fill out = to complete by providing requested information, especially on a form

On the date of transfer of ownership for the new house we had purchased, there were many
papers that we needed to complete by providing information.

FRONT

Sandy was looking for a summer job so she filled out applications at several local stores.

BACK

Sandy estava procurando por um trabalho de verão, então ela <u>preencheu</u> aplicações de emprego em muitas lojas locais.

fill out = to complete by providing requested information, especially on a form

At the beginning of summer Sandy went to many stores and provided information by writing in the blanks on many applications.

FRONT

When Linnea applied for financial aid for college, she had to provide lots of personal information when <u>filling out</u> the online forms

BACK

Quando Linnea se candidatou para o auxílio financeiro para a faculdade, ela teve que providenciar muitas informações pessoais ao <u>preencher</u> os formulários online. **fill out** = to complete by providing requested information, especially on a form When requesting monetary help to attend university Linnea had to go online and provide a lot of information on financial aid websites.

FRONT

The secretary at the doctor's office asked me to <u>fill out</u> a form that asked about my medical history.

BACK

A secretária no escritório do médico me pediu para <u>preencher</u> um formulário que perguntava sobre o meu histórico médico.

fill out = to complete by providing requested information, especially on a form

When I went to see my physician, the secretary gave me a piece of paper in which I had to

answer many questions in written form about my medical history.

FRONT

Every quarter the post office asks me to $\underline{\text{fill out}}$ a questionnaire rating my local branch as a place to work.

BACK

A cada trimestre a estação de correios me pede para <u>preencher</u> um questionário classificando minha filial local como lugar de trabalho.

fill out = to complete by providing requested information, especially on a form

Every three months the Postal Service asks me to answer questions in written form in order

for me to give feedback regarding the working conditions at my particular location.

FRONT

I was skinny as a teenager but I started to fill out in my mid 20s

BACK

Eu era magrelo quando era adolescente mas comecei a inchar por volta dos 20.

fill out = to gain weight or become fleshier or bulkier

Even though I was thin as an adolescent my body started to become a little bulkier as I entered my adult years.

FRONT

As our metabolism slows down in midlife we tend to fill out a little bit more.

BACK

Como nosso metabolismo fica mais lendo no meio da vida, nós tendemos a <u>inchar/engordar</u> um pouco mais.

fill out = to gain weight or become fleshier or bulkier

Unfortunately as we reach middle-age we tend to gain weight because our body does not burn calories as effectively.

FRONT

Adam had always been kind of scrawny, but after spending time in the gym he started to <u>fill</u> <u>out</u> nicely.

BACK

Adam sempre tinha sido meio esquelético, mas depois de passar tempo na academia ele começou a <u>inchar</u> bem.

fill out = to gain weight or become fleshier or bulkier

Adam had never been particularly toned, but after working hard in the weight room over an extended period of time, his physique became more muscular.

FRONT

The last time I tried to wear those shorts was a year ago, and I have <u>filled out</u> since then so now they don't fit.

BACK

A última vez que eu tentei usar aquelas bermudas foi a um ano atrás e eu <u>inchei</u> desde

então, portanto acho que elas não servem.

fill out = to gain weight or become fleshier or bulkier

In the year that has passed since the last time I wore those shorts, I have unfortunately put on a few pounds and I can no longer zip the zipper all the way up.

FRONT

After spending time in the wilderness his face was gaunt, but after he started to eat properly his face <u>filled out</u> and he regained his strength.

BACK

Depois de passar tempo na selva, seu rosto estava magro, mas depois que ele começou a comer adequadamente seu rosto inchou e ele recuperou sua força.

fill out = to gain weight or become fleshier or bulkier

After an extended period of time in the wild it was apparent on his face that he was malnourished, but after resuming a healthy diet his face became full and healthy again.

FRONT

Billy's grades are bad because he often forgets to hand in his homework on time.

BACK

As notas de Billy estão ruins porque ele frequentemente esquece de <u>entregar</u> seu dever de casa no prazo.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

Billy frequently fails to give his assignments to his teachers by the deadline, and as a result his grades are not good.

FRONT

As a result of major policy disagreements, the Attorney General <u>handed in</u> his resignation to the President

BACK

Como resultado dos desentendimentos da grande política, o procurador geral <u>entregou</u> seu pedido de renúncia ao presidente.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

The Attorney General is not agreeing with the President about some very important policy issues and as a result he has decided to inform the president that he no longer wants to continue in his post.

FRONT

Anybody interested in applying for the position of letter carrier needs to <u>hand in</u> their application by the first of the month.

BACK

Qualquer interessado em se candidatar para o cargo de carteiro precisa <u>entregar</u> sua solicitação até o primeiro dia do mês.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

The first day of the month is the deadline for giving to the post office your application for

the position of letter carrier.

FRONT

The kindergarten teacher asked the kids to <u>hand in</u> their artwork by the end of the day so she could display it in the lunch room.

BACK

Os professores do jardim de infância pediram para as crianças <u>entregaram</u> seu trabalho de arte até o fim do dia para que pudessem exibi-lo no refeitório.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

The teacher requested that her young students physically give her the art that they had been working on by the end of the school day so that she could place it in a prominent place for all to see in the lunch room.

FRONT

I need to <u>hand in</u> my request for vacation time right away so that I can start planning our trip!

BACK

Eu preciso <u>entrega</u>r minha solicitação de férias agora mesmo para que eu possa começar a planejar nossa viagem!

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

At my place of employment I need to submit to my boss the dates that I want for vacation so that we can begin deciding what to do and where to go on our voyage.

FRONT

The planning committee <u>handed in</u> their proposal for a new park to the mayor yesterday.

BACK

O comitê de planejamento <u>entregou</u> sua proposta de um novo parque par ao prefeito ontem.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

The committee which has been commissioned to make plans for the city gave their idea for a new park to the mayor.

FRONT

I forgot to <u>hand in</u> my keys before leaving the hotel, so I got an angry call from the hotel manager on my cell phone

BACK

Eu esqueci de <u>entregar</u> minhas chaves antes de deixar o hotel, então eu recebi uma ligação nervosa do gerente do hotel no meu celular.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

The manager at the hotel was very upset that he had to call me after I left because I failed to return my room key before my departure.

FRONT

When his parents discovered that he had stolen a car, they <u>handed him in</u> to the police.

BACK

Quando seus pais descobriram que ele tinha roubado um carro, eles <u>o entregaram</u> para a polícia.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

When the thief's parents realized that he had stolen the car, they informed the police that they knew what he had done.

FRONT

Make sure you <u>hand in</u> your cake recipe to Jean on Sunday, because she's trying to compile the church cookbook.

BACK

Certifique-se de <u>entregar</u> sua receita de bolo para a Jean no domingo, porque ela está tentando compilar o livro de receitas da igreja.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

Jean is trying to collect recipes for a church cookbook and you need to provide Jean with your recipe for a cake by Sunday.

FRONT

Don't forget to hand your towels in at the front desk after swimming in the hotel pool.

BACK

Não se esqueça de entregar suas toalhas na recepção depois de nadar na piscina do hotel.

hand in = to deliver or submit something to someone

When you are done swimming in the hotel pool, you need to remember to go to the front desk to return the towels that you used.

FRONT

At first, Facebook was popular primarily among young people, but it finally <u>caught on</u> with older people as well.

BACK

No começo, o Facebook era popular primariamente entre os jovens, mas ele finalmente <u>se</u> <u>popularizou</u> com as pessoas mais velhas também.

catch on = to become popular

At the beginning most of Facebook's users were young but over time it became more popular with older users too.

FRONT

Samba is popular in parts of Brazil, but it has never really caught on in the United States.

BACK

O samba é popular em partes do Brasil, mas ele nunca realmente <u>ficou popular</u> nos Estados Unidos.

catch on = to become popular

Samba is well known in parts of Brazil, but it is still not well known or popular in the United States.

FRONT

Before the Second World War radio was a popular form of entertainment, but shortly after the war television <u>caught on</u> and very quickly surpassed radio as a primary source of entertainment and news.

BACK

Antes da segunda guerra mundial o rádio era uma forma popular de entretenimento, mas pouco tempo depois da guerra, a televisão <u>se popularizou</u> e ultrapassou o rádio como fonte primária de entretenimento e notícias.

catch on = to become popular

After World War II television quickly became very popular and replaced radio as the leading source of entertainment around the world.

FRONT

I feel quite confident that the Brazilian practice of eating rice and beans every day will never catch on in the United States.

BACK

Eu estou bem confiante que a prática brasileira de comer arroz e feijão todo dia nunca irá <u>se</u> popularizar nos Estados Unidos.

catch on = to become popular

It's very unlikely that Brazilian cuisine will ever become widely popular in the United States.

FRONT

I thought my directions would confuse you, but you're catching on very quickly!

BACK

Eu pensei que minhas instruções iriam confundir você, mas você está <u>pegando</u> bem rápido! **catch on** = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

I originally was dubious that you would be able to clearly understand my directions, but it's obvious that you are quickly understanding everything I'm telling you.

FRONT

When my girlfriend told me she needed some space, <u>I didn't catch on</u> at first to the fact that she was really trying to break up with me.

BACK

Quando a minha namorada me disse que ela precisava de um pouco de espaço, <u>eu não</u> <u>entendi</u> no começo o fato de que ela estava na verdade tentando terminar comigo.

catch on = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

At the beginning I didn't realize that my girlfriend was trying to dump me when she told me that she needed some time to herself.

FRONT

I'm a natural born linguist who <u>catches on</u> very quickly when trying to learn a new language.

RACK

Eu sou um linguista natural que <u>pega as coisas</u> muito rápido ao tentar aprender uma nova língua.

catch on = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

I have a natural gift for languages, and I understand and learn new languages easily and quickly.

FRONT

When Jose arrived in the United States he spoke very little English, but he <u>caught on</u> quickly and now he is quite fluent.

BACK

Quando José chegou nos Estados Unidos ele falava muito pouco inglês, mas ele <u>aprendeu</u> rápido e agora é bem fluente.

catch on = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

Even though Jose could barely speak English when he first arrived here, he managed to learn

very quickly and now is very proficient.

FRONT

Yesterday I started to try to teach my five-year-old daughter how to ride a bike, and she caught on very quickly! Within two hours she was riding her bike all over the neighborhood.

BACK

Ontem eu comecei a tentar ensinar minha filha de cinco anos a andar de bicicleta, e ela <u>pegou</u> muito rápido! Dentro de duas horas ela estava andando em sua bicicleta por toda a vizinhança.

catch on = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

Within two hours of me trying to teach my small daughter to ride a bike, she had figured it out and learned how to do it and it was confidently biking all over the place.

FRONT

We were teasing Sally, but it took her a little while to <u>catch on</u> that we were just joking and her feelings got hurt.

BACK

Nós estávamos provocando a Sally, mas levou um pouco de tempo para ela <u>entender</u> que nós estávamos só brincando e seus sentimentos foram feridos.

catch on = to understand what something means, or to learn to do something

Unfortunately Sally felt offended when we were teasing her because she did not understand at the beginning that we were only joking.
