## PROGRESSIVE FORMS IN CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

I bet you never heard about conditional forms using "ing", right? But yes, it is totally possible to happen. Even in conditional sentences, progressive verb forms are used in progressive situations.

One thing you need to remember is that we **cannot use stative verbs** in progressive verb forms!

You can check the use of progressive verb forms in the following examples.

TRUTH: It **is raining** right now, so I **will not go** for a walk.

CONDITIONAL: If it **were not raining** right now, I **would go** for a walk.

TRUTH: I **am not living** in Chile. I **am not working** at a bank.

CONDITIONAL: If I **were living** in Chile, I **would be working** at a bank.

TRUTH: It **was raining** yesterday afternoon, so I **did not go** for a walk.

CONDITIONAL: If it **had not been raining**, I **would have gone** for a walk.

TRUTH: I **was not living** in Chile last year. I **was not working** at a bank.

CONDITIONAL: If I **had been living** in Chile last year, I **would have been working** at a bank.
