

PROGRESSIVE FORMS IN CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

I bet you never heard about conditional forms using "ing", right? But yes, it is totally possible to happen. Even in conditional sentences, progressive verb forms are used in progressive situations.

One thing you need to remember is that we **cannot use stative verbs** in progressive verb forms!

You can check the use of progressive verb forms in the following examples.

TRUTH: It is raining right now, so I will not go for a walk.

CONDITIONAL: If it were not raining right now, I would go for a walk.

TRUTH: I am not living in Chile. I am not working at a bank. CONDITIONAL: If I were living in Chile, I would be working at a bank.

TRUTH: It was raining yesterday afternoon, so I did not go for a walk.

CONDITIONAL: If it had not been raining, I would have gone for a walk.

TRUTH: I was not living in Chile last year. I was not working at a bank.

CONDITIONAL: If I had been living in Chile last year, I would have been working at a bank.
