#### **almost** /'ɔ:lməʊst/

EXAMPLE

I **almost** forgot your birthday.

#### **although** /ɔ:l'ðəʊ/

EXAMPLE

**Although** small, the kitchen is well designed.

#### **already** /ɔ:l'redi/

EXAMPLE

I'm **already** late.

#### **awe** /ɔ:/

EXAMPLE

I stared at the clouds, in **awe** of their beauty.

#### **law** /b:/

EXAMPLE

The reforms have recently become **law**.

#### **saw** /sɔ:/

EXAMPLE

I **saw** him last week.

#### **call** /kɔ:l/

EXAMPLE

We usually **call** him by his nickname.

#### **small** /smɔ:l/

EXAMPLE

The world seems so **small** now.

**ball** /bɔ:l/

EXAMPLE

He kicked the **ball** into the net.**talk** /tɔ:k/

EXAMPLE

I can't **talk** about it just now.**walk** /wɔ:k/

EXAMPLE

I always **walk** to school.**chalk** /tʃɔ:k/

EXAMPLE

He picked up a piece of **chalk** and wrote the answer on the blackboard.**lawyer** /'lɔ:ɪər/

EXAMPLE

You would be wise to consult a **lawyer**.**false** /fɔ:ls/

EXAMPLE

He used a **false** name to get the job.**always** /'ɔ:lweɪz/

EXAMPLE

She **always** arrives at 7.30.**August** /ɔ:'gʌst/

EXAMPLE

They got married last **August**.**water** /'wɔ:tər/

EXAMPLE

They survived for two days without food or **water**.

**author** /'ɔ:θər/

EXAMPLE

Who is your favourite **author**?**abroad** /ə'brɔ:d/

EXAMPLE

He worked **abroad** for a year.**boss** /bɔ:s/

EXAMPLE

I'll ask my **boss** if I can have the day off.**login** /'lɔ:ɡɪn/

EXAMPLE

Enter your **login** and password and press 'go'.**thought** /θɔ:t/

EXAMPLE

Such a **thought** never entered my head.**caught** /kɔ:t/

EXAMPLE

She threw the bottle into the air and **caught** it again.**bought** /bɔ:t/

EXAMPLE

I just **bought** a new car.**taught** /tɔ:t/

EXAMPLE

They **taught** him to read.**daughter** /'dɔ:tər/

EXAMPLE

We have two sons and a **daughter**.

**wrong** /rɔ:ŋ/

EXAMPLE

I got all the answers **wrong**.**song** /sɔ:ŋ/

EXAMPLE

We sang a **song** together.**long** /lɔ:ŋ/

EXAMPLE

She had **long** dark hair.**gone** /gɔ:n/

EXAMPLE

'Where's the coffee?' 'It's all **gone**.'**more** /mɔ:r/

EXAMPLE

There is room for no **more** than three cars.**door** /dɔ:r/

EXAMPLE

Open the **door**!**floor** /flɔ:r/

EXAMPLE

His glass fell to the **floor** and broke.**war** /wɔ:r/

EXAMPLE

My grandfather fought in the **war**.**four** /fɔ:r/

EXAMPLE

Look at page **four**.

**north** /nɔːrθ/

Which way is **north**?
